

Improved Clarity and Accuracy

Indicators will be better defined, become more assurable, and be explained through technical protocols. A tiered reporting system will be established to accurately reflect the degree to which the Guidelines were applied by an organization.

Stronger Support During the Reporting Process

GRI will provide greater guidance on applying reporting principles, determining materiality, prioritizing report content, and engaging with stakeholders.

Greater Compatibility and Harmonization

G3 will strive to be more compatible with other CSR tools and standards, and to provide improved utility for analysts and financial markets.

Increased Ease of Use Through a New Technology Platform

A new interactive website will be developed to enhance the ease of use of the Guidelines. The G₃ taxonomy will be developed using open source XML/XBRL code to facilitate information flow and linkages with existing management information systems.



A series of new user-focused programs will be offered to meet the needs of the sustainability reporting community. These programs will also ensure GRI's financial self-sufficiency so that it can continue to steward the Sustainability Reporting Guidelines far into the future.

Enhanced Membership Scheme

GRI's current Organizational Stakeholder program will be revamped to provide high value services related to accessing the Guidelines, educational materials, and profiles of registered reports.

Educational Offerings

Beginner and experienced practitioners will have access to training sessions, workshops, tools, calculation examples, case studies, bulletin boards, a help desk, and a manual on use of the Guidelines.

Professional Accreditation

Under consideration is a program to accredit professionals in the field of sustainability reporting who demonstrate their understanding of the GRI reporting framework.

Report Registration

Organizations will have the opportunity to register their reports through the G3 website and indicate its tier level. This will enable GRI to formally acknowledge the report and provide a forum for public access.
